

Auto accident fatal to Shirley Kincer

Funeral services were held this morning at the Thornton Regular Baptist Church for Miss Shirley Ann Kincer, 22, who died Monday morning of injuries received in an automobile accident.

The Rev. Ray Collins, the Rev. John H. Polly and the Rev. R. Stanley officiated. Burial was in the Mayking Cemetery.

The wreck in which Miss Kincer was fatally injured occurred about 5 p. m. Sunday in Breathitt County, some 16 miles north of Jackson.

Miss Kincer was a passenger in a car driven by Bobby Holbrook of Thornton. She and her fiancé, Norman Holbrook, a brother of the driver, were riding in the back seat of the car and she was asleep with her head against the window. The crash occurred as

the car and a cattle truck owned by Ivan Childers of Hindman attempted to pass each other. The rear of the truck struck the side of the car against which the girl was leaning. Her head was crushed. She was taken to Good Samaritan Hospital in Lexington, where she died about nine hours later without having regained consciousness.

No one else was injured.

The young people were returning to jobs in Louisville and Indiana after vacations with their families in Letcher County. The girl had been employed by the Retail Commercial Agency in Louisville for several years. She formerly worked for Whitesburg Insurance Agency and went to Louisville when the agency took over an office there.

She was a graduate of Whitesburg High School and Bryan-Stratton Business College in Louisville. She would have been 23 September 7.

Survivors are her parents, Alfred Clinton and Ruby Swindle Kincer, Mayking; a sister, Patsy Kincer, Louisville, and two brothers, Bobby Arnold Kincer, Whitesburg, and Gary Kincer, Mayking.

Craft Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.
